

ТЕСТ ПО АНГЛИЙСКОМУ ЯЗЫКУ 2016-2017 уч.г.

Экзаменационная работа по иностранному языку состоит из 2 разделов и содержит задания, проверяющие навыки грамматики, лексики, чтения и письма. Максимальное количество баллов – 100 (за задания уровня А – 40 б, за задания уровня В – 60 б).

Раздел 1 – Чтение – включает 2 задания. Задания типа **А** направлены на понимание содержания текста. Каждому правильному ответу соответствует **4** балла. В заданиях типа **В** необходимо установить соответствие между содержанием текста и его заголовком. За каждое правильно установленное соответствие – **5 баллов. Максимальное количество баллов – 36.**

Раздел 2 – Грамматика и лексика. Каждому правильному ответу в заданиях типа **А** соответствует **2** балла. Каждому правильному ответу в заданиях типа **В** соответствует **4** балла.
